#### **Second Announcement**

The Nordic Council<sup>1</sup>, the Baltic Assembly<sup>2</sup> and the Benelux Interparliamentarian Consultative Council<sup>3</sup> jointly invite you to attend a trilateral parliamentarian conference on energy **10-11 December 2004 in Oslo, Norway**, at the Norwegian Parliament Building, 'Stortinget'.

The conference will be conducted in English with simultaneous Finnish, French, Russian and Scandinavian translation.

## Political and Financial Tools to Promote Sustainable and Secure Energy Supplies

#### Objective

The conference will be addressing how the challenge of promoting sustainable and secure energy supplies is approached by the Nordic, Baltic and Benelux countries.

Market forces clearly cannot serve as the sole instrument of energy policy. The aim of this conference is to seek efficient political and financial instruments to promote development of sustainable energy production, to increase energy efficiency, and to reduce energy dependence.

An expert review benchmarking the Nordic, Baltic and Benelux countries in relation to EU-policies will soon be available as a conference booklet.

#### **Background**

According to the EU Green Paper 'Towards a European Strategy for the security of energy supply' (2001), the share of energy supply in the European Union that has to be imported was expected to rise from the present 50% to 70% with the enlargement of the European Union to 25 member states.

Moreover, the EU goal of raising the proportion of *renewable energy* sources from 6% to 12 % has certainly not yet been shown to be progressing. What is needed to speed up the process?

The energy market is in the process of becoming liberalised and internationalised. One example is the EU internal market for gas and electricity. This is a challenging development, one of the main aims being to provide cheaper energy for the consumer. Recent power cuts, price fluctuations and price increases for electricity are nevertheless what consumers are currently confronted with in a number of European countries. What is the benefit of market liberation for the consumer?

The *Kyoto Protocol* obligations are in the process of being fulfilled by the signatories. Which are the mechanisms that governments use to reduce CO<sup>2</sup> emissions and achieve their reduction targets?

Some countries have decided to reject *nuclear power*. Others, like Sweden and Germany, have decided to phase out their nuclear contribution. And recently Finland decided to enlarge their nuclear production by the building of a new reactor. What will be the future of nuclear power in Europe?
