The reason why I think this, is due to the fact that I am a liberal person, and therefore a true supporter of Anders Fogh Rasmussen and his party.

Where is the liberalism and freedom of choice in this new proposal?

I will never forget a speech of Mr. Rasmussens, when he made it clear that there has got to be a choice, and that choice is and will always be up to the individual to take and that he would ensure that the political climate as such would ensure the room for choice .....this was music to my ears!!!!!!
