SUB-RECIONAL SOUTH ASIAN PARLIAMENTARY SEMINAR ON HIV/AIDS

NATIONAL ASSEMBLY OF PAKISTAN ISLAMABAD, PAKISTAN JANUARY 14-15, 2005

Parliamentarian for Global Action (PGA), whose membership spans 110 countries around the world, in collaboration with World Health Organisation (WHO), UNAIDS, UNFPA and Aga Khan University is ho ting a high-level Parliamentary Seminar on HIV/AIDS in South Asia to be held at the National Assembly of Pakistan in Islamabad on January 14-15, 2005. The seminar will be hosted by D. Noor Jehan Panezai, MP (Pakistan) and will act as a forum for the dissemination of information and the exchange of experiences between MPs on HIV/AIDS issues in South Asia and, most impostantly, the roles MPs can play in addressing the epidemic.

The Workshop is organized with the kind support of UNFPA, WHO, UN Foundation, Swedish and Australian Governments and will involve about 60 parliamentarians, including high-ranking MPs and Minist is of Health from Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, the Maldives, Nepal, Pakistan and Sri Lanka as well is MPs from Uganda, Thailand and Brazil, countries where successful policies to tackle the spread of the pandemic have been implemented. In addition to the parliamentarians, internationally a mowned experts in the area, including Dr. Nafis Sadik, Special Representative for the UN Secretary-General for HIV/AIDS in South Asia, will participate and address the meeting. Key representatives of the local, regional and national press will also be invited to the seminar in order to generat; media coverage, and ensure that key messages are conveyed to the public.

The seminar will act as a forum for the dissemination of information on the nature and extent of the virus in South Asia, its modes of transmission, impact, which strategies have been documented to work in comba ing the virus, and, most importantly, the roles MPs can play in increasing political commitment to address the epidemic.

Given that HIV prevalence is proportionately low in the populations at large in South Asia, a great deal of the foc is of discussion will be on preventing HIV/AIDS, and scaling up effective pilot programs. Fu thermore, the seminar will analyze the underlying factors which can accelerate the spread of HIV/AIDS, with special attention given to addressing the needs of young people, particularly young women, in acquiring the skills to negotiate safer sex, and therefore to protect themselves and heir families.

The Seminar will also generate a Declaration of Action that will provide the basis for parliamentary follow-up activities to tackle the spread of the virus in South Asia.
