Food Congress 2005

Main Themes

It is with great pleasure that we invite you to participate in the LMC 2005 Food Congress:

Danish Food Science 2005 – from molecule to man

The congress highlights the four major research areas within the strategy of LMC: Molecule, Microbiology, Food Matrix, and Man. The aim of the congress is to visualize national research activities and strengthen the collaboration with the Danish food industry.

Day one will focus on the ongoing research activities at LMC, where participants will have the opportunity to exchange achieved scientific news. The programme at day one will consist of a plenary session, parallel sessions and a poster presentation. Language will be English.

Molecule

Genomics, proteomics and molecular interactions are new and highly advanced disciplines for molecular characterisation of food and food components.

Microbiology

To improve our understanding of the complexity of food microbial interactions new techniques have been developed including functional genomics and nano- and microscale technologies.

Food Matrix

Food matrices and processes are complex multifactorial systems. The assessment of the overall food product quality and functionality includes basic research and new process analytical technologies and process modelling.

Man

New advanced methods within research in human nutrition and sociology of food consumption include controlled clinical studies, consumer behaviour, sensory science, paediatric nutrition and human health experiments.



Sessions

Plenary sessions

The plenary sessions will focus on new scientific initiatives within LMC. Newly appointed professors within LMC will highlight the strength of Danish food research.

Internationally, Danish food science has proven to be successful. The congress will comprise lectures concerning large international projects coordinated by Danish scientists.

Parallel and poster sessions

The parallel sessions will be based on selected abstracts received before January 14th, 2005 and organised within the four main themes: Molecule, Microbiology, Food Matrix, and Man. Further ongoing research related to the main themes of the congress can be presented at the poster session.

Please note that the scientific committee will award the best poster presentation given by a Ph.D. student.
