## Conference in Lisbon on the 20th anniversary of the Council of Europe Charter of Local Self-Government (8 July 2005)

Strasbourg, 04.07.2005 – A conference in Lisbon on 8 July will mark the 20th anniversary of the Charter of Local Self-Government.
