


Judge Jean-Louis Bruguière


Vice-President of the Tribunal de Grande Instance de Paris

Jean-Louis Bruguière is First Vice-President of the *Tribunal de Grande Instance de Paris*, where he is responsible for the coordination of the judicial aspects of the fight against terrorism in France.

Judge Bruguière graduated from the National School for Magistrates (Ecole Nationale de la Magistrature) in Bordeaux. He started his career in the French judiciary in Evreux in 1973, investigating mostly organised crime cases. He was transferred to Paris in 1976 and, in 1982, started specialising in anti-terrorist cases. His first major investigations between 1982 and 1987 involved the French radical group, Action Directe, and its activities in connection with other radical groups in Germany, Italy and Belgium.

In 1986, Judge Bruguière was appointed to the newly created anti-terrorist division in Paris. Since then, he has directed and co-ordinated French efforts against Islamic terrorism. He led the operation to find and arrest the international terrorist Carlos the Jackal in 1994, investigated the terrorist bombings in Paris in 1995-1996, as well as many national and international movements affiliated with Al-Qa'eda. His investigations contributed to the dismantlement of several large terrorist networks in Europe.

This experience has earned him the highest distinctions in France and made him an internationally recognised expert on terrorist networks worldwide and anti-terrorist policies. Judge Bruguière acts as expert for the Council of Europe on the oversight of security services. He has participated in numerous conferences worldwide and authored several articles. Czechoslovakia
