What Future for the Small Islands of Europe?

Bowmore, Island of Islay, Scotland 21/22 November 2006

Europe is a continent fringed by small islands. Many of us look to these islands for leisure and recreation, a peaceful environment away from the bustle of modern day life, where traditional life is preserved. But what of the people who live there all year round? How, in this world of information technology, i-pods and internet do our small European islands fit in?

Funded by the European Commission's INTERREG Programme, the European Small Islands Network have been examining, over the past 2 years, the challenges faced by small islands: from transportation to wind turbines, from island identity to innovation. This project has taken over 200 islanders from 6 member states on island exchange visits where they have experienced first hand examples of best practice in 18 different areas of activity on islands.


3 main areas of interest have guided these 18 areas of activity:

- Ecologically sustainable island development
- Provision of essential public services and facilities

Reports on these themes, the experiences of the islanders themselves and debates on the main issues will all be presented at the project's final conference on the Island of Islay, Scotland on 21/22 November 2006. This debate seeks to inform all levels of government on the needs of small islands in Europe as well as reaffirming the vital role that they play in contributing to a diverse and sustainable Europe.
