Emne: Det kinesiske folk behøver vor hjælp!

Bønder i Heilongjiang-provinsen kræver "menneskerettigheder fremfor olympiske lege".

Vi har modtaget 2 dokumenter fra Heilongjiang, den nordligste provins i det nordøstlige Kina, som giver anledning til stor bekymring:

1. Åbent brev til præsident Jacques Rogge, den Internationale Olympiske Komite, om at stille krav til Kina om i anledning af OL 2008 at overholde menneskerettighederne på en række specificerede punkter. Brevet er underskrevet af over 20.000 kinesiske borgere. NB: De over 7000 bønder i Fujin som er blevet frataget deres jord var de første underskrivere. De 7000 første underskrifter blev indsamlet af en bonde, Yang Chunlin, som gik fra dør til dør i landsbyerne og indsamlede underskrifter. Idag bliver denne bonde og en anden bonde, Wang Guilin, udsat for grusom tortur i et kinesisk fængsel. Bag det åbne brev og tilhørende underskriftskampagne står: All-China Alliance for protecting Human Rights and Opposing Violence.
2. Åbent brev til kinesiske landsmænd om i anledning af OL 2008 at stille krav til det Kinesiske Kommunistparti om at overholde menneskerettighederne på en række specificerede punkter. Bag det åbne brev står: China Liberal Democratic Party.

Netværk for Menneskerettigheder i Kina skal hermed opfordre det danske folketing og den danske regering til at slutte op omkring disse 2 kampagner og lægge et kraftigt pres på den kinesiske regering for, med anledning af OL 2008, at få den til at overholde menneskerettighederne. De grove krænkelse af menneskerettighederne som de kinesiske regering gør sig skyldig i og OL 2008 kan ikke sameksistere. Hvis ikke der bliver gjort en kraftig indsats kan man befrygte at OL 2008 i stedet for at fremme menneskerettighederne vil blive misbrugt til at undertrykke menneskerettighederne. Dette finder faktisk allerede sted.

China does not need the Olympic Games! China urgently needs human rights and democracy!

——An open letter to Mr President Jacques Rogge The International Olympic Committee

Dear President Rogge:

The human rights situation in China has been even worse since April of last year when you expressed your concerns in China's human rights as addressing the 2008 Beijing Olympic Games in your opening statement to the IOC Executive Board meeting in Seoul, South Korea.

It is now less than one year from the 2008 Beijing Olympic Games, and the Chinese government is putting on a false show of peace and prosperity. It wants to push down every noise criticizing the government. This is why it is sweepingly suppressing the people's human rights movement, and punishing the brave ones like Mr. Yang chenlin, and Mr. Wang guilin..

The innocent foreign media in China were implicated in the recent suppression, and would suffer from more restrictions than ever before. This has been evidenced by the widely deprecated Measures for Administering the Release of News and Information in China by Foreign News Agencies released by the Chinese government last month. All what happened has demonstrated that the crackdown on the well known Chinese human rights defending leaders, Mr. Yang chenlin, and Mr. Wang guilin, was only a part of the plan that would carry out pre-cleaning up for the 2008 Beijing Olympic Games.

We certainly want to see a harmonious society of China with real peace and prosperity, and are not unconditionally against the 2008 Beijing Olympic Games. However, the Beijing Olympic Games must seriously abide by the Olympic Charter that states "any form of discrimination with regard to a country or a person on grounds of race, religion, politics, gender or otherwise is incompatible with belonging to the Olympic Movement". Therefore, the harmony of the Beijing Olympic Games should be achieved neither by sacrificing the human rights of Chinese people nor by depriving their rights to defend themselves.

We clearly remember the concerns of the world when Beijing was applying for staging the 2008 Olympic Games, and how Beijing swore to good faith to IOC. We also clearly remember the ardent expectation of many friends on the improvement of the human rights situation in China, including you and Mr. Juan Antonio

Samaranch, the former President of IOC. Five years later, how much has China progressed in human rights? The arrest of Mr. Yang chenlin, Mr. Wang guilin and Mr. Guo is a distinct answer to this question.

President Rogge, we noticed that President Samaranch had iterated that the 1988 Seoul Olympic Games was a transition point in South Korea's history. In addition, we are aware of that you mentioned, on the IOC EB meeting in Seoul early last year, the successful 30 years of continuous boycotting South Africa for its apartheid. On the same meeting, you clearly told Beijing that IOC wants "full respect for human rights" and "they must be respected". In view of this, we are writing this letter to you.

We understand that IOC is neither a political nor a human rights organization. Nevertheless, in line with the Olympic Charter that disseminates and protects humanitarianism and harmonious development of human being, we believe that IOC is obliged to urge the Chinese government to earnestly fulfill its promise of improving human rights it made when applying for staging the Games. In addition, IOC should reflect on itself for the 1936 Nazi Olympics. As the 2008 Beijing Olympic Games is counting down, IOC needs to make constructive efforts for release of these people:

We eagerly hope that IOC would watch on human rights in today's China as on South Africa before.

We are hereby calling upon The International Olympic Committee, to do everything within your power to make the following demands to the CCP:

Before, during and after the Olympic Games 2008, the CCP should conscientiously put into effects all the international human rights treaties to which China is a signatory state:

Before, during and after the Olympic Games 2008, the CCP should not evict, put under house arrest, detain or arrest migrant workers, political dissenters, rights-preservation people, Falun Gong practitioners, family church members and people who have come to Beijing to voice their grievances:

The CCP should stop torturing and psychologically tormenting political prisoners and should guarantee their human rights;

The CCP should stop harassment and persecution of internet and other media authors and reporters, and to guarantee the freedom of the press;

The CCP should stop surveillance over the mothers whose children were killed in

June 4th Tian'anmen Massacre of 1989, and guarantee their personal safety and freedom of movement;

The CCP should stop suppression and persecution of any individual or organization that is engaged in the protection of weak social groups, natural resources, animals and the environment;

The CCP should stop suppression of the 1957 "Rightists" and their families who are appealing for justice;

After the Games, the CCP should refrain from retaliatory acts against people who are entitled to the freedom of speech, freedom of the press and freedom of assembly.

All the above demands are in conformity with the legal rights granted to Chinese citizens by the current Chinese Constitution. Only when the Chinese citizens are allowed to enjoy their legal rights without fear can the Beijing Olympic Games be held smoothly.

The above are our basic human rights demands. Should the CCP regime ignore the people's wishes, cling obstinately to its course, and continue to inveigle the international community and dupe the Chinese public, then we would have no choice but issue our call loud and clear: China does not need the Olympic Games! China urgently needs human rights and democracy!

We sincerely look forward to hearing from you.

Since their voice was heard through international media, the Chinese Communist Party (CCP) authorities have been persecuting them harshly. Many of their representatives have been arrested, jailed, or summoned to the police. The CCP has blocked all passages of their communication with international community. Violent abuses of human rights once again shroud the land of China, where Olympic Games is going to be held……

These 7000 signatures were collected by a peasant named Yang Chunlin, who walked from village to village and knocked from door to door to collect signatures. His feet were so badly blistered that they bled, and he coughed up blood. Today, at this moment, Yang Chunlin and another peasants representative Wang Guilin are being tortured savagely in a Chinese prison.)

Today, in Olympia, before Prometheus, we solemnly swear that we shall remain fearless in our fight against evil and we shall keep marching on when faced with darkness. We shall take to the world the fire that Prometheus procured at the cost of his life, to the Chinese people oppressed in darkness.

We must also point out that the International Olympic Committee and big multinational businesses that have huge vested interest in Beijing Olympic Games have betrayed the Olympic spirit and the civilized principle of human rights and human dignity. They turn a blind eye to the abuses of human rights committed by the Chinese Communist authorities, thus degrading themselves into a part of the force that persecutes the Chinese people and an accomplice to the Chinese Communist Party.

Beijing Olympic Games: Crimes Under the Cover of National Spirit —An Open Letter to All Fellow Chinese

The countdown has started for Beijing Olympic Games that is scheduled to open on August 8th, 2008. Now the Chinese Communist Party (CCP) is making the final dash. Stimulated by the shining rings of the Olympic Games, Chinese nationalistic sentiments are getting madder and madder. After the June 4th Massacre, the CCP realized that with all its legitimacy gone, the only straw it could clutch was Chinese nationalism. Only by inciting nationalistic sentiments can it cover up its opposition to the Chinese people and its crimes of murdering the Chinese people. At the same time, under the terror of totalitarianism where "Political stability is above all", nationalism has become the only channel for people to vent their resentment.

Under the cover of nationalism, the vested interests of the CCP prate about "a harmonious world" in order to obtain the maximum benefits from the West, and adopt a policy of appeasement towards the US, Japan, and other countries. Domestically, however, they deliberately stir up anti-American and anti-Japanese hatred with a view to propping its autocratic rule and averting social conflict. On the issue of Taiwan, the CCP plays up the traditional nationalistic idea of "a Great Unified China" and, under the pretext of "opposition to Taiwanese independence", totally negates the economic achievements of Taiwan and vilifies the political freedoms and democracy in Taiwan. With the cooperation of some politicians in Taiwan, the CCP propaganda has been quite effective, resulting in a new generation of "angry young men", who grew up after the June 4th Massacre in 1989 and, ignorant of Chinese history and the contemporary world, have become puppets in CCP nationalistic performance, raving bellicose slogans on international issues.

While inciting hatred against the outside world, the CCP does all it can to prettify Chinese history. All the icons of Chinese feudalism – the Qin, Han, Tang and Qing Dynasties, which the CCP trashed in its revolutionary days, are now looked up to as shining models of a strong and prosperous China. As a result, Qin Shi Huang Di, Han Wu Di, Emperor Ming of Tang, Empress Wu Ze Tian, Emperor Kangxi and Emperor Yongzheng have been paraded as heroes in Chinese cinema and TV productions. CCP men of letters use the past to whitewash the rulers of today, and officials are busy doing obeisance to Confucius.

Glories of the past, of course, are not enough to stir up nationalistic sentiments; what is more effective is the theatricals of the "golden age of today" – the TV

series of "The Rise of Great Nations", the Shanghai World Expo and the Beijing Olympic Games. Of these, the Beijing Olympic Games is the most eye-catching. The CCP is feverishly promoting the Games as a manifestation of national spirit. Every and each propaganda machine is in full swing: a promotion film alone has cost ¥35 million. Alongside with multifarious tricks of promotion, the CCP throws money about like dirt, leaving the wealthy US and Europe dumbstruck.

The successful bidding of the Games sparked a wave of euphoria across the country. Disregarding serious and urgent problems in the Chinese society, the CCP puts its propaganda machine in high gear – it urges the people to do everything for the Games, do everything to support the Games, think nothing but the Games. The Olympic Games has been portrayed as something magical, as if the success of the Games would solve all the problems of China, China would hereafter become a powerful country, a world power, and it would no longer be necessary to conceal its ambition of world hegemony.

With such intention in mind, the CCP will spend an enormous fortune on the Games, with the total budget of USD35.3 billion. This sum is 3.1 times that spent on the Athens Games, and 43.6% of all the Olympic Games costs put together since the 1976 Montreal Games. The tree planting project alone, supposedly to make the near desert of Beijing green, will cost ¥120 billion. The CCP even has the grandiose plan of making the waters in Southern China flow into Beijing to provide drinking water for the Games. For a developing country like China, such squandering of monies is nothing short of lunacy.

In spite of the fast growth of Chinese economy in recent years, China's national income per capita is only USD 1,700, falling far behind the rich countries in the world, even USD 150,000 less than that of Greece, the last Olympic Games host and the poorest country in Europe. With such low income per capita the CCP tries to put on a super Olympic Games that will outshine all previous ones – a megalomaniacal intention at the expense of the livelihood of the common Chinese people. What is more, the USD 1,700 income per capita is a national average, and a yawning gap exists between the rich and the poor, the majority of the Chinese people live on several hundreds of US dollars a year. According to a wealth report published in 2006, 135 million Chinese, i.e. 10% of the population live under the poverty line of one dollar a day. At the same time, 50 million youngsters are unable to go to school, 40% of the general population are too poor to go to seek medical care when sick, and this figure rises to 60% in rural China. China's social security scheme only covers 3 million people, and as few as 1% of the Chinese people enjoy any sort of social

security. The environmental protection funds, which have bearings on the survival of the Chinese nation, fall short by half. All these statistics show that, while squandering astronomical sums of money on the Olympic Games, the CCP is acting with utter disregard to the education, medical care, social security, and the very survival of the Chinese people.

When the CCP was bidding for the hosting of the Olympic Games 2008, it gave a public pledge to the international community that it would improve human rights and freedom of the press. Since its successful bidding, however, the human rights situation in China has deteriorated instead of being improved. It has resorted to armed suppression in dealing with rights-preservation movements, carried out surveillance and threat, jailed and imposed heavy sentencing on dissidents, as well as beaten up, arrested and removed by force people who appeal to higher authorities for grievances. It has further strengthened its control over the media and book publications. Any article that exceeds slightly what is "proper" will result in the discharge of the editor, shutting down of the newspaper or magazine, and the persecution of the author. Internet control has become all the more horrendous, with tens of thousands of the internet police keeping close watch on internet users 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Many bloggers have been arrested and imprisoned. In order to create harmonious and beautiful surroundings, the Beijing authorities will evict from the city all migrant workers as well as those who have come to the capital to voice their grievances. Many of the migrant workers have been toiling in the Olympic construction sites, but they will not only be barred from attending Olympic events but will suffer the humiliation of forced removal from the city. The CCP violation of human rights has become almost lunatic and hysterical.

As the money spent on the Olympic Games are Chinese Tax-payers', every Chinese person has made contributions to the Games, but the Games will not be for the common Chinese people. 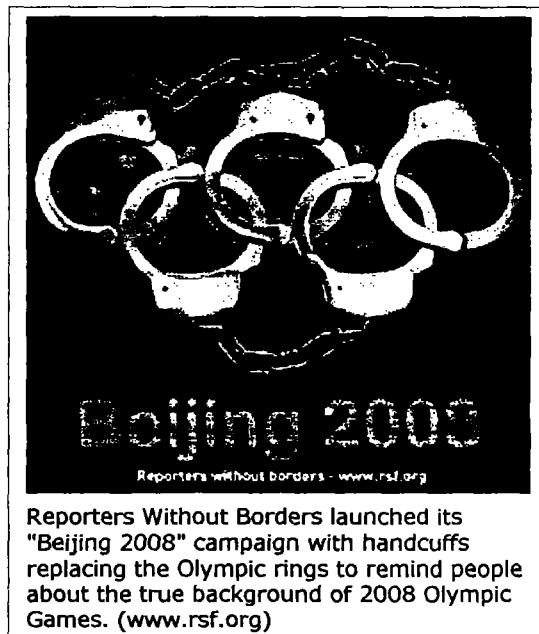

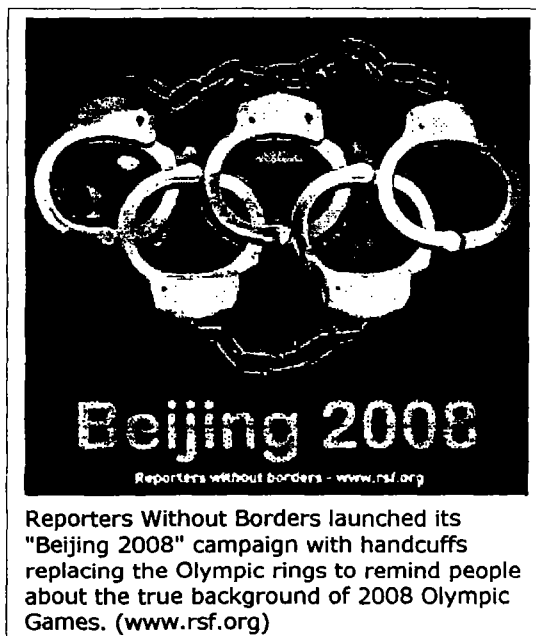
