

## CURRICULUM VITAE

Hervé JOUANJEAN was born on 28 September 1949 at Neuilly sur Seine, France.

He is married with two children.

He has a Diploma in Economics and Finance from the Institut d'Etudes Politiques, Paris, a Doctorate (DES) in Economic Science and a Doctorate (DES) in Political Science from the University of Paris.

In 1973/1974 Hervé JOUANJEAN worked at the Ministry of Industry in Paris and in 1975/1976 worked in the banking sector (CIC – Paris).

Hervé JOUANJEAN joined the Directorate General for External Relations at the European Commission at the end of 1976. He first worked on the Enlargement Task Force (Greece, Spain and Portugal) in charge of economic, financial and budgetary matters. Then, from 1982 to 1986 he was the negotiator for textile agreements with Mediterranean countries and the ACP countries. In 1987 Hervé JOUANJEAN joined the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT) Division. In 1989, he became Head of the Unit responsible for the development of the EU's new external policies in connection with the completion of the EU's internal market programme. Between 1993 and 1995 he was Deputy Head of the Permanent Delegation of the Commission in Geneva to the International Organisations (WTO, UN). Following his return to Brussels, he became director in the Directorate General for External Relations in 1996 (now the Directorate General for Trade), and was responsible for all matters relating to the OECD and the WTO and worked extensively on the Doha Development Agenda.

In July 2003 he was appointed Deputy Director General of the Directorate General for External Relations, in charge of relations with Asia (except Japan and Korea) and Latin America.

On 1 January 2007 he was appointed Deputy Secretary General of the European Commission and in particular represents the Commission at the Permanent Representative's Committee (COREPER).
