Dear Per Væggemose Nielsen,

Please allow me to contact you.

I am Danish living in Entebbe, Uganda running a tourist project across Lake Victoria.

Recently the president of Brazil visited Cong to encourage Africa to start production of Ethanol, as he and others are convinced the whole world will turn to Ethanol faster than the production units can come up.

In Uganda, which is a donor recipient country of Danish Bilateral Assistance and Transfer of Technology, the people very much want to copy the Danish Cooperatives, which made Danish Agriculture, Milk and Meat Products to reach a high standard and to empower the farmers.

I am therefore consulting you regarding:

1. If you will assist us re. how we can get started with a production of Ethanol in Uganda?
  - a. Upstart budget 20,000 € finance.
2. if you could be interested in adopting Nkumba University Entebbe [www.nkumbauniversity.ac.ug](http://www.nkumbauniversity.ac.ug) as development partner in your science and teaching of technology?

Uganda is one of the world's most fertile countries, and a most ideal country to start cooperative production of Ethanol. Millions of out growers in the region would eye Ethanol production as the most profitable production they could get into.

#### **Denmark - Uganda**

If Denmark as host of the World Climate Conference 2009 decided to stop using oil and petrol, and instead decided to import all of its energy as Ethanol from Uganda, this could easily cover the

energy consumption of Denmark, including Danish Ships and aircrafts taking off from Kastrup Airport.

- Denmark could with pride host the Copenhagen World Climate Conference; demonstrating to the world the way forward, how to stop leading out CO2.
- Denmark would no longer need to support Uganda aid, saving 100 mill. USD per year.
- Uganda's farmers and economy would flower and make Uganda a most as wealthy and developed country.

What Uganda is missing, is technical know-how and education.

If DTU Bio Centrum would adopt Nkumba University as partner, this would not only help Uganda and Denmark but help the world with an efficient way to stop let out of CO2 gasses.

Uganda is connected to an oil pipeline, which connects to Port of Mombasa on The Indian Ocean. This pipe could possibly be used to export of Ethanol, and e.g. Maersk Line changes their engines to Ethanol.
