Dear Speaker,

First of all, I should like to welcome the participation of the national parliaments in the round table of 7 April 2008 on the revision of Framework Directive 2002/475/JHA on combating terrorism. This debate had a very positive outcome: the comments made by national and European members of parliament were submitted to the Council, which took account of them and revised its position.

Building on the positive results of this initial exercise, the Committee on Civil Liberties, Justice and Home Affairs of the European Parliament (the LIBE committee) wishes to invite Members of National Parliaments once again, to take part in a joint debate on the strategy recently presented by the Commission on the protection of the EU's borders. This round table, entitled '**Freedom and Security in the integrated border management of the European Union**', will be held on **Monday, 30 June 2008 from 15.00 to 18.30** at the European Parliament in Brussels.

We shall review the current management of the EU's external borders, particularly with regard to the migration of the Schengen system (SISII)¹, the strengthening of the Frontex agency² and the prospect of a European 'entry-exit' system, as well as linked aspects such as data profiling³. As indicated in the enclosed draft programme, representatives of the Commission and the EU Council, together with experts in EU border management and

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academics, will be invited to answer all the questions put to them by European and national members of parliament.




