### THIRD COMMITTEE DRAFT RESOLUTION Rapporteur Ms. Natalia Karpovich (Russian Federation)

- 1. <u>Recognising</u> the devastating effect that the current global financial crisis is having on people across the world,
- 2. <u>Underlining</u> that vulnerable and marginalised sections of the population are effected disproportionately and are suffering particularly hard,
- 3. <u>Noting</u> that no part of the OSCE is immune to the social and humanitarian consequences of the ongoing crisis,
- 4. <u>Recalling</u> previous OSCE PA declarations addressing the particular challenges of vulnerable groups such as women, children, national minorities, and migrants,
- 5. <u>Convinced</u> that urgent action is needed to safeguard against further marginalisation of atrisk groups,
- 6. <u>Recalling United Nations Security Council Resolution 1325</u> which specifically notes the disproportionate impact of armed conflict on women, and recognizes the under-valued and under-utilized contributions women make to conflict prevention, peacekeeping, conflict resolution and peace-building,

#### The OSCE Parliamentary Assembly:

- 7. <u>Notes that</u> at-risk groups are typically the first ones to suffer from economic difficulties, and the last ones to recover;
- 8. <u>Encourages</u> participating States to promote policies aimed at increasing inclusiveness in the workforce;
- 9. <u>Affirms</u> the importance of equitable access to education for all children and youths to facilitate their quick entry into the labour market;
- 10. <u>Regrets that</u> women's economic dependency on men, particularly in times of economic difficulty, makes women easy targets for oppression and abuse, as well as potential victims of prostitution and human trafficking;
- 11. <u>Urges</u> the OSCE, field missions, and participating States to redouble efforts to combat trafficking in human beings through preventative programmes;
- 12. <u>Recognises</u> the crucial role that the family and traditional social networks play in assisting at-risk individuals and groups, and encourages participating States to increase support for such networks;
- 13. <u>Calls upon</u> parliamentarians to be particularly vigilant in fighting intolerance against minorities and other vulnerable groups, who are often made scapegoats during times of financial difficulty;

- 14. Urges participating States to vigorously combat child labour, particularly through:
  - a) comprehensive legislation outlawing all exploitative child labour,
  - b) special training for law enforcement personnel on methods to identify victims of child labour;
  - c) mechanisms protecting victims of this crime,
  - d) support programmes to assist victims' entry into schools;
- 15. <u>Calls upon</u> participating States to redouble efforts aimed at fighting paedophilia, child poverty, and the involvement of children in crime, including through partnership programmes with mass-media aimed at bringing greater focus to these crimes;
- 16. <u>Requests</u> participating States to increase efforts aimed at establishing bilateral cooperation agreements on child adoption issues, ensuring that the best interests of children are always maintained;
- 17. <u>Notes</u> the difficulties faced by children after a divorce between parents who are different nationalities, and urges that all efforts, including legislation, be aimed at ensuring that the best interests of the children are protected in custody arrangements;
- 18. <u>Further urges</u> OSCE parliamentarians to actively facilitate international exchange of best-practice in addressing the particular needs of vulnerable social groups;
- 19. <u>Reminds</u> that during conflicts, particular care must be taken to protect the human rights of civilians.
