It is with great pleasure and honor that we invite one representative of your Parliament to Kigali on the 17th and 18th of May 2010 to celebrate the advancement of women. As the country with the highest percentage of women parliamentarians in the world and as part of a fresh commitment to promote, accelerate and sustain gender equality, Rwanda is hosting an International Forum on the Role of Leadership in Promoting Gender Equality and Women's Empowerment.

The International Forum coincides with the 30th anniversary of the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women, the 15th anniversary of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action, the 10th anniversary of the United Nations Security Council Resolution 1325 on Women, Peace and Security, the 5th anniversary of the African Union's Solemn Declaration on Gender Equality in Africa, and the implementation of the Pact on Security, Stability and Development in the Great Lakes Region.

AIDE MEMOIRE

Introduction

As the country with the highest percentage of women parliamentarians in the world and as part of the continuous commitment to promote, accelerate and sustain gender equality, Rwanda is hosting an International Forum on the Role of Leadership in Promoting, Accelerating and Sustaining Gender Equality and Women's Empowerment on the 17th and 18th of May 2010 in Kigali.

The International Forum coincides with the 30th anniversary of the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW), the 15th anniversary of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action (BPFA), the 10th anniversary of the United Nations Security Council Resolution (UNSCR) 1325 on Women, Peace and Security, the 5th anniversary of African Union's Solemn Declaration on Gender Equality in Africa (SDGEA), and the implementation of the Pact on Security, Stability and Development in the Great Lakes Region.

With dynamic sessions and interactive panels, the forum will offer an important opportunity for regional women leaders to find solutions to problems facing the ordinary woman in their respective communities; for global players to share best practices in advancing the gender agenda; and for all participants to identify obstacles to reaching collective goals. The gathering will be a rate occasion to re-double our overall commitment to advancing the cause of women, inspired by Rwanda's progress in that sector.

Why Rwanda?

Under President Paul Kagame's stalwart leadership, Rwanda has emerged as a global leader in the fight for gender equality. Women hold several leadership positions across key public institutions and community based organizations. For example, the nation has the highest percentage of female parliamentarians in the world (56%) - with a woman Speaker of the Chamber of Deputies; 52% representation in the judiciary with a woman as the President of the Supreme Court; over 30% representation in the Cabinet, leading some of the most important posts, including the Ministries of Foreign Affairs, Trade & Industry, Agriculture, and Gender & Family Promotion; and 54% representation in local government.

Women also lead other key institutions, including Rwanda Revenue Authority, Human Rights Commissions, the Gacaca Court, National Commission on AIDS, Auditor General, Rwanda Environment Management Agency, and the Gender Monitoring Unit. The inclusion of women in public life has been critical to promoting peace and reconciliation as well as rebuilding a social fabric left in tatters by the genocide.

In Rwanda, however, gender equality is not simply about people, it's also about policies. The creation of a special Ministry of Gender and Family Promotion has led to the enactment of important new laws on property rights and gender-based violence. Such violence — which both the Rwandan government and UN Security Council have rightly identified as a security threat — has further been reduced through the establishment of gender desks within both Rwanda's national army and police force.

Taken together, these achievements have made Rwanda a case study in gender equality and women's empowerment as a means to social and economic transformation. It is within this

context that Rwanda is organizing the International Forum on the Role of Leadership in Promoting, Accelerating and Sustaining Gender Equality & Women's Empowerment.

<u>Purpose</u>

Using Rwanda as a launching point, the forum will build upon the progress made in implementing CEDAW, BPFA, UNSCR 1325, SDGEA and the Pact on Security, Stability and Development in the Great Lakes Region. The Forum will further generate new ways of achieving the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) and realizing the promise of UNSCR 1820 which confronts sexual violence in conflict and post-conflict situations.

Themes

The programme will focus on sharing experiences, lesson learned and best practices along the following four areas:

- 1. Governance, Peace, Justice and Security
- 2. Women's Economic Empowerment
- Gender and the Environment
- 4. Women's Health and Education

Specific Goals

- 1. Build upon the progress in implementing CEDAW, BPFA, UNSCR 1325, UNSCR 1820, SDGEA and the Pact on Security, Stability and Development in the Great Lakes Region in promoting gender equality and women's empowerment;
- 2. Presentation of the regional action plan on the Great Lakes Protocol on punishment and suppression of sexual violence against women and children in the Great Lakes Region countries;
- 3. Measure the progress in implementing the 2007 Kigali Declaration on Gender, Nation Building and the Role of Parliament;
- 4. Share experiences, lessons learned and best practices in promoting gender equality and women's empowerment;
- 5. Identify challenges and define ways to accelerate progress towards gender equality, women's empowerment and the elimination of violence against women;
- 6. Take stock of emerging issues that have an impact on gender equality and women's empowerment and promote partnerships to build and sustain change towards a gender equitable society.

Expected Outcomes

- 1. Leaders commit to promoting, accelerating and sustaining gender equality and women's empowerment.
- 2. Leaders commit to accelerating the implementation of the Pact on Security, Stability and Development in the Great Lakes Region.
- 3. Develop a Gender Agenda for Promoting, Accelerating and Sustaining Gender Equality and Women's Empowerment.
- 4. Strengthen and build new strategic alliances and partnerships to move the gender agenda forward.
- 5. Launch the Centre of Excellence for Women's Leadership.

Format

The two-day forum will feature an opening event, followed by a series of high level plenary sessions tailored to foster collaboration and interaction among a diverse group of participants. Documentaries and films on best practices will be viewed. These sessions will be followed by field visits which will afford participants a firsthand look at how Rwanda's efforts to promote gender equality are being implemented.

Main Events of the International Forum

- 1. International Conference on the Great Lakes Region (ICGLR) workshop was held in Kigali on the 26th of March 2010. The member countries developed a common agenda, harmonized regional action plan on women, peace, security and development, and agreed to work together on accelerating and harmonizing the implementation of regional and international instruments (e.g. UN Resolution 1325 on Women, Peace and Security) and will be presented at the International Forum on the 17th and 18th of May 2010.
- 2. 'One Million Women's March for a Better Future' is a major event on the eve of the International Forum, 16 May 2010, in which women across the country will march in celebration of the advancement of women, and to show their support for the continuous commitment to promoting, accelerating and sustaining women's empowerment and gender equality. The march, which is expected to draw a million women, will symbolize the steps the leadership and Rwandans are taking, and galvanize action towards a better future.

Documentation

The Forum conveners will prepare working documents based the five themes and made available to the participants during the meeting.
