Dear «12+ Member»,

As soon as ever I had arrived thus far in my investigation of the slave trade, I confess to you sir, so enormous so dreadful, so irremediable did its wickedness appear that my own mind was completely made up for the abolition. A trade founded in iniquity, and carried on as this was, must be abolished, let the policy be what it might; – let the consequences be what they would, I from this time determined that I would never rest till I had effected its abolition.

-William Wilberforce, Abolition Speech, 1789

It is over 200 years since William Wilberforce's speech on slavery was made in the British Parliament. Can we say that the legacy of William Wilberforce has survived? Around the world millions of people, mainly women and children, are being tricked, lured and coerced from their homes; they are then exploited and forced to work with little or no payment in a modern form of slavery: human trafficking.

This process of Human Trafficking is very present in Europe and we can identify all three areas within our continent - the countries of origin, transit and destination. Parliamentarians from around Europe therefore have a joint responsibility to raise awareness of this practice and put a stop to the misery suffered by thousands of people each year.

With this regional seminar we are inviting parliamentarians from around Europe to come together not so much to discuss laws outlawing trafficking, but to highlight how parliamentarians should get better involved in ensuring the

enforcement and implementation of existing legislation and the Council of Europe Convention on Action Against trafficking in Human Beings. In this context we will rely heavily on the experience of parliamentarians in securing support from the police, the border agencies and NGOs, and to highlight the importance of NGO involvement with victim protection. Our purpose is to have a conference with a difference where parliamentarians share best practice and discuss how each parliament can better operate; whether it be to combat child or sex trafficking or trafficking for forced labour and domestic slavery. A key input to the discussion will be the IPU/UN Handbook 'Combating Trafficking in Persons'.

Please find enclosed a registration form, which we invite your Parliament to return to the British Group of the IPU Secretariat no later than 22 January 2010. The conference room in the House of Commons has limited seating capacity, which is why we kindly request your Parliament to limit its delegation to a maximum of three people, including advisers and secretaries. English and French interpretation will be provided.

Lastly, we would like to point out that participants should handle all matters relating to their visas, hotel accommodation and transportation. To facilitate hotel bookings, we enclose a reservation form which participants may wish to use. Both forms, along with the provisional programme of the seminar and other relevant documents, will be posted on the IPU website shortly.

We look forward to the participation of your Parliament in the Seminar.
