



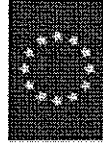
JDP Implementation

- **CCIC (MS or CFCA) and ACC ensuring real time cooperation**
- **Permanent exchange of information (e.g. VMS) and intelligence**
- **Daily recommendations and target vessel list based on risk management**

JDP Assessment

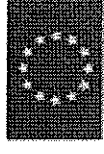


Two components

- **Effectiveness: Provides a feed-back for improvements of Joint Control operations**
- **Identification of Risks of non-compliance: Done jointly, identifies common risks and facilitates the definition of specific objectives for Joint Campaigns (Regional Risk Analysis)**
- ***EAV: common exercise, transparent, according to a common methodology, identifies best practices and training needs***

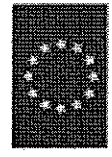
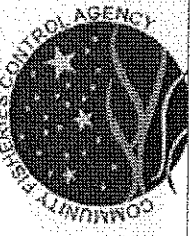

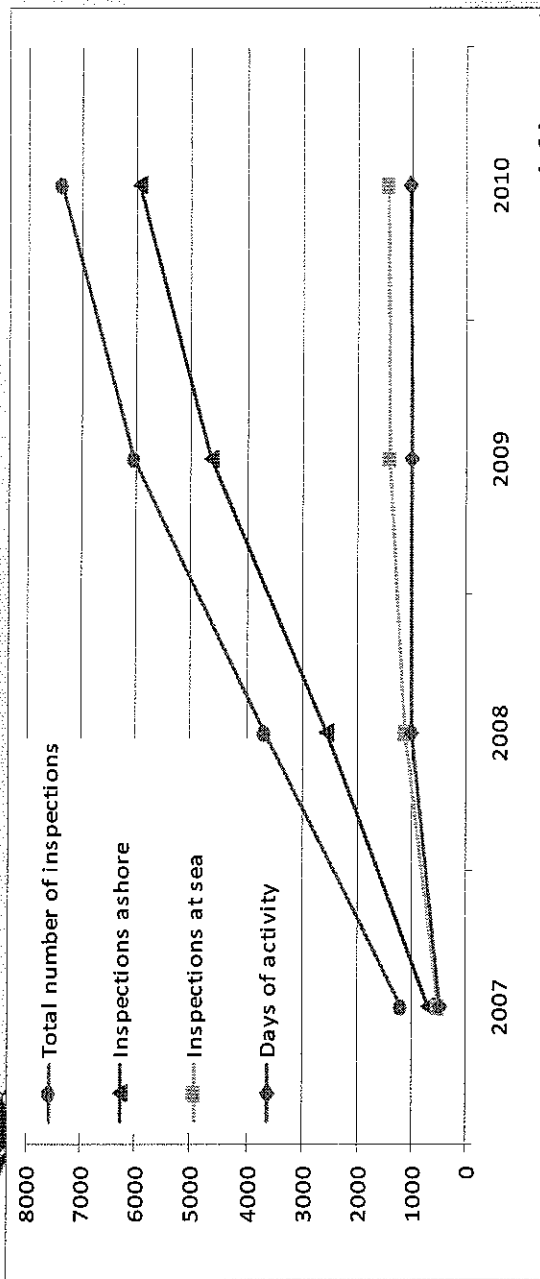

European success factors

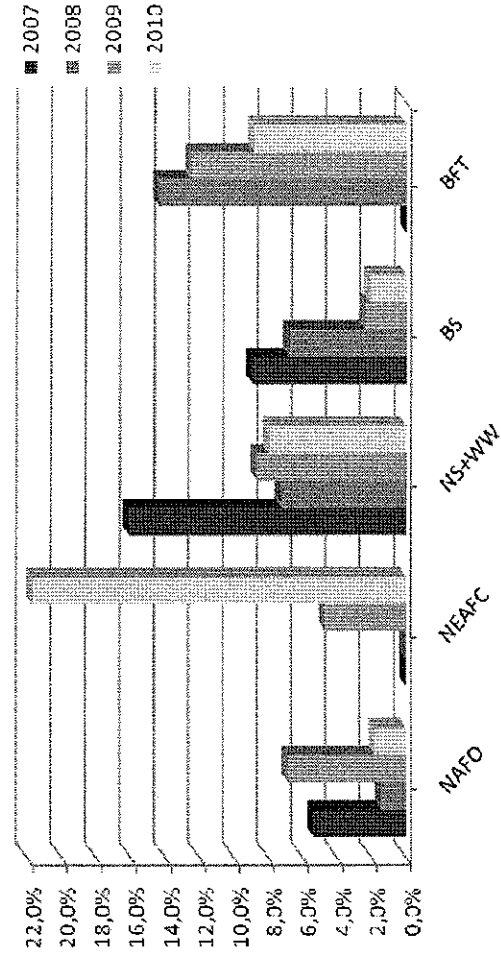
- ***Working group created for a common approach on risk analysis, exchange of experiences and promotion of best practices***
- ***Audit missions in Third Countries***
- ***Workshops for exchange of experiences between MS***

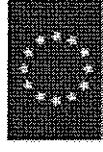
Infringement ratio, per geographical area, 2007-2010

Start in 2007

Situation of overfishing of cod improved significantly

European Success factors:

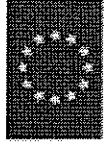
- *RAC organised Control Conference in 2007*
- *CFCA brokered cooperation between MS and contributed to transparency*

Future Risks:

- *Vessels no longer authorised to fish cod may still fishing other species and possible illegal fishing of smaller vessels*



North Sea



Start 2007

Consolidation of improvements in control by MS through contributing to a level playing field

European success factors:

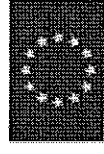
- *RAC organised Control Conference in 2008*
- *Steep increase of cooperation between MS*
- *More effective joint control, inspection and surveillance campaigns notably in southern North Sea – permanent campaign*

Future challenges:

- *Establishment of regional control areas to ensure better relation cost-effectiveness (same effectiveness but less costly)*
- *Ways to avoid high grading discarding*



Future orientations: Towards Regional Control Areas

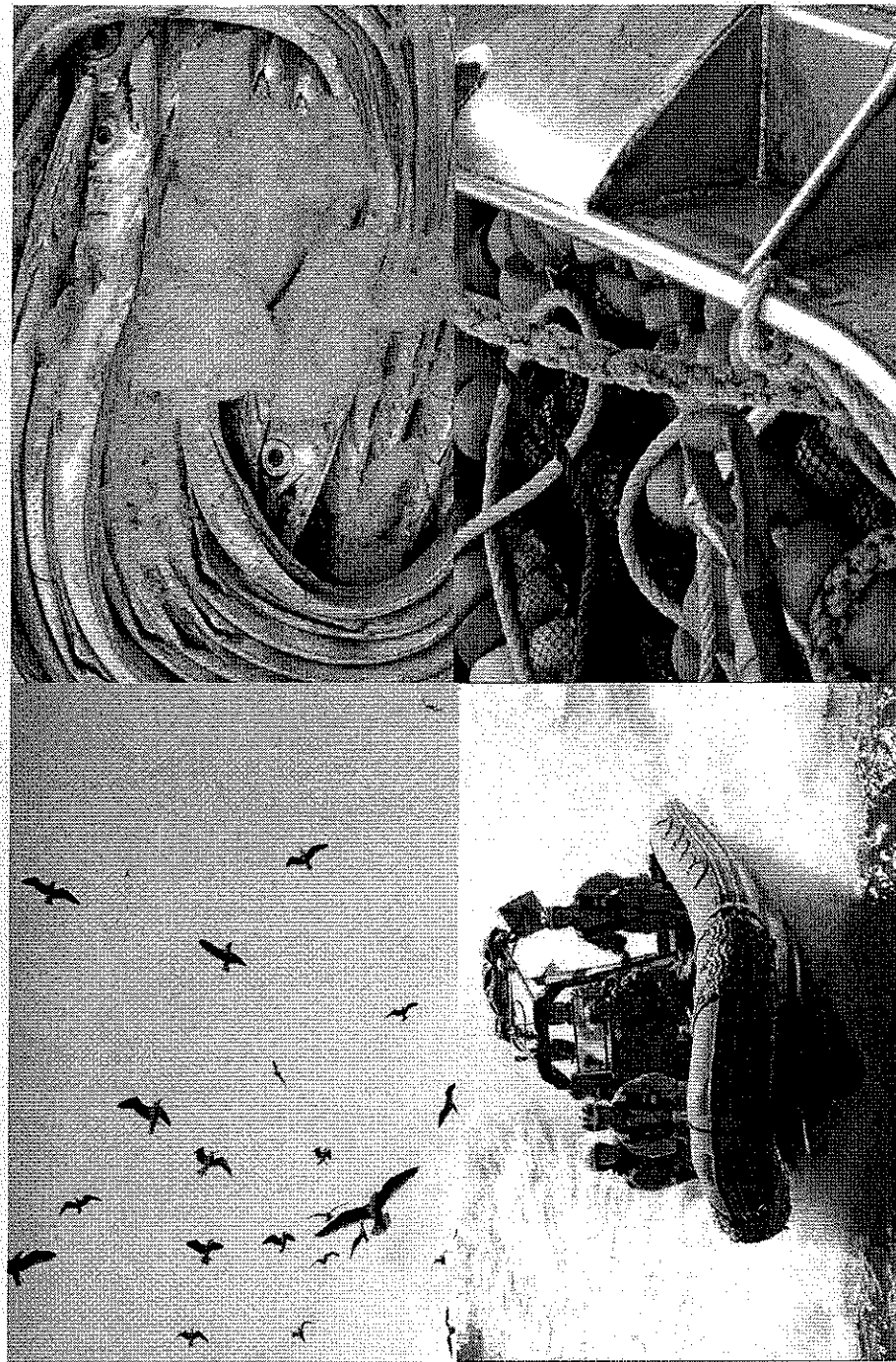
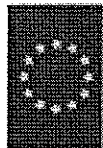


Against a background of increasingly scarce public funding

- Make the most of MS control assets by:
 - Avoiding the unnecessary concentration human and material resources over short periods
 - Promote rational and complementary joint deployment of the resources available at MS
- More flexible and year-round JDPs, covering wider range of species
- Permanent exchange of information and intelligence
- Common evaluation
- No extra burden to MS
