It is my pleasure to invite you to the high-level conference entitled "Jobs for Europe" organized by the European Commission in Brussels on 6-7 September 2012.

Building on the Employment Package adopted by the Commission on 18 April 2012 and on the outcomes of the 2012 European Semester, this conference will aim to further develop a European agenda for a job-rich recovery, drawing on the best practices in employment policies from across Europe.

The presence of Presidents M. Schulz (European Parliament), H. Van Rompuy (European Council), J.M. Barroso (European Commission) as well as of Italian Prime Minister M. Monti, Prof. C. Pissarides (Nobel Prize for Economics) and A. Gurria (Secretary-General of the OECD) has already been confirmed. The audience will comprise a variety of stakeholders from the Member States, including representatives from labour ministries, public employment services, economic and social councils, social partners, national parliaments as well as academics.

The conference will be structured around five main topics:

1. Building a dynamic European labour market (considering transitions, human capital investment and mobility)
2. Impact of the crisis on employment (looking at "programme countries", wage levels and their adjustments, as well as the situation of jobless households)
3. Sectors with high job-creation potential (and in particular, the green economy, 'white' jobs, and ICT)
4. Employment policy throughout the life cycle (with a focus on youth, on gender and work-life balance and on active ageing)
5. Pathways to full employment (discussing the concept of a job guarantee, the role of social economy, and welfare-to-work measures)

The conference will take place at the Commission's Charlemagne Conference Centre (170 Rue de la Loi). The Commission will cover the necessary travel and accommodation expenses for **one attendee from each parliamentary chamber** of EU Member States.
