Background

Climate change is rarely the sole cause of conflict, but it can intensify and multiply existing conflicts over natural resources. How should development cooperation address this challenge, and what are the experiences from past efforts at addressing conflict over natural resources at the local, national and transboundary levels?

These issues will be explored through presentations of experiences from East Africa, the Sahel and the Nile Basin by three prominent international speakers, Kennedy Mkutu, Marie Monimart and Ana Cascao, who will discuss root causes of conflicts and efforts to address them in relation to pastoral conflicts in Kenya, 'Peace Wells' in Niger, and transboundary water management in the Nile basin.
