The purpose of the conference is to contribute to the theme of Smart Defence and increase the understanding of what strategy a small state member of NATO, such as Denmark, could pursue in order to promote:

- That the Smart Defence initiative actually materializes and becomes an
 effective tool for the future.
- That access to shared/pooled capabilities is guaranteed.
- That the questions and challenges of sovereignty are discussed and dealt with.

Smart Defence is a "work in progress" and in its initial stage. It's time to focus on the underlying nature and dynamics of Smart Defence and assist the process of formulating small state strategy by improving the understanding of these. Three themes are key:



- Political Leadership: How should political leadership be done in practice? How can Multinational projects be influenced by a small nation?
- Guaranteed access: If Smart Defence is about pooling and sharing capabilities, how do we ensure that "security comes when we call"?
- Sovereignty: How do we handle this and other issues like Joint Air Policing?
