He will draw on his own experiences and plot a course for the contribution of each of us in solving the challenge of a generation and pass on a planet in better shape than today.

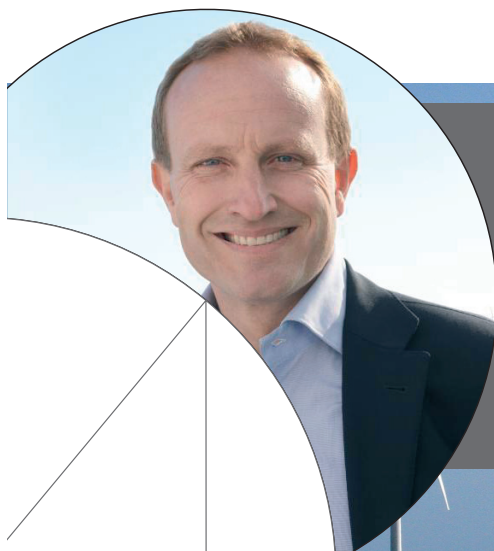

Martin Lidegaard was appointed as Minister for Climate, Energy and Building in 2011. He has been a Member of Parliament for the Social Liberal Party from 2001 to 2007 and holds a master's degree in communications.

From 2008 to 2011 he was the co-founder and chairman of the think tank CONCITO, and in 2008 he worked as a communications consultant for RelationsPeople. Lidegaard has also served as head of information and deputy general secretary of ActionAid Denmark as well as chairman of the Danish 92 Group, a coalition of 23 NGO's working on issues related to the environment and development.
