Invitation til møde med repræsentanter fra Syrien den 17. marts 2016

Den syriske paraplyorganisation, Mobaderoon, som er aktive i store dele af Syrien, er inviteret til Danmark af Liviafonden og Center for Konfliktløsning.

Der er arrangeret møde med 3 repræsentanter fra Mobaderoon, Gada Rifai, Houda Fansa, Luma Nourallah og Rahaf Alsharif,

Liviafonden oplyser følgende om Mobaderoon: De laver fredsarbejde på tværs af etnicitet og politiske tilhørsforhold i meget vanskelige situationer. De opbygger de unge til lederskab, så de kan genopbygge Syrien, når det kan lade sig gøre. De blev indstillet til Liviaprisen af tidligere ambassadør Rolf Holmboe og modtog den i København i 2014. Mobaderoon was launched in 2010 and is a social active network working mostly inside Syria with a clear vision building trust, citizenship and peaceful coexistence. The network work to empower youth with the required skills for a positive change in their local community. Mobaderoon also provides training on PSS – psychosocial support.

It is a network for 52 local organizations and more than 4,000 activists on both the opposition and government side of the conflict working in all regions in Syria except in ISIS dominated areas. Its coordinating unit is situated in Beirut, Lebanon. The members are engaged and empowered to develop their own initiatives with focused capacity building programs, such as Peace Ambassadors, Social Leadership, and Active Citizens. These leaders themselves are the catalysts of change in their local communities. The network has in the past received support from the Danish Embassy, Sida, Unicef, Danmission, FDCC(Forum for Development, Culture and Dialouge) The British Council and DIFD, and it was recommended by the Danish Ambassador to Lebanon, Syria and Jordan for the Livia Prize, which they recieved in 2014.
