Aminatou Haidars arbejde:

Aminatou Haidar (born 24 July 1966), sometimes known as *Aminetou*, *Aminatu* or *Aminetu*, is a <u>Sahrawi</u> human rights activist and an advocate of the independence of <u>Western Sahara</u>. She is often called the "Sahrawi <u>Gandhi</u>" or "Sahrawi <u>Pasionaria</u>" for her nonviolent protests. [1][2][3] She is the president of the <u>Collective of Sahrawi Human Rights Defenders</u> (CODESA). She was imprisoned from 1987 to 1991 and from 2005 to 2006 on charges related to her independence advocacy. In 2009, she attracted international attention when she staged a <u>hunger strike</u> in <u>Lanzarote Airport</u> after being denied re-entry into Moroccan Western Sahara. Haidar has won several international human rights awards for her work, including the 2008 <u>Robert F. Kennedy Human Rights Award</u> and the 2009 <u>Civil Courage Prize</u>.
