Visit 1: Aalborg New Harbourfront

Guided tour by ship along the new Harbourfront. Aalborg's waterfront has recently undergone a thorough renovation. It was once Aalborg's industrial heart, but its shipyards and heavy industries had mostly died out by the 1980s. Thus began the waterfront's transformation into a cultural and cozy quarter.

Visit 2: Vestre Fjordpark and Egholm

Guided tour by bicycle to Vestre Fjordpark and the ecological island Egholm.

Vestre Fjordpark is an open-air swimmingpool and activity center offering outdoor activities such as to sail the Limfjord by kayak or canoe, windsurf, bathe, or simply enjoy the lovely nature.

Egholm is the largest ecological island in Denmark providing 100% organic farming.

Visit 3: Halkær Ådal

Guided tour by bus at Halkær Ådal.

Halkær Ådal is a river valley where nature restoration has improved the biodiversity significantly. The nature is protected by organic farming and living provided by the local residents. The area is classified as Natura 2000.
