

- → **WORLD STORIES** is an annual series of 20 documentary films made by acclaimed filmmakers that tell stories from the world to the world.
- → WORLD STORIES reaches hundreds of millions of viewers annually through our unique network of local and national broadcasters in 191 countries. This includes UN Futura (Brazil), VTC (Vietnam), NTCU (Ukraine), TV Rain (Russia), BHRT (Bosnia), BBSC (Bhutan), Wattan (Palestine), Al Jadeed (Lebanon), WGBH (USA), BBC World News and BBC Arabic.
- → **WORLD STORIES** has the largest audience of any human interest focused documentary film strand in the world.
- → **WORLD STORIES** SEASON 1 was launched in 2015 and followed up by SEASON 2 in 2016. SEASON 3 is broadcasting now.

# **HOW WORLD STORIES WORK**

- → Our editorial team selects 20 outstanding documentary films per year and edits each film to a 45 minute television version.
- → The films are selected to represent a broad spectrum of social justice and human rights issues within the following categories: culture & everyday life civil & politcal rights war & peace inequality & development gender & sexuality
- → The films are licensed, versioned, updated and dubbed into local languages for broadcast partners around the world.
- → The series is broadcast on local channels in countries such as Afghanistan, Bosnia Herzegovina, Palestine, Ukraine, Bhutan, Vietnam, Colombia, Brazil and many more.

### Rehad Desai / South Africa / 2014

In August 2012, mineworkers in one of South Africa's biggest platinum mines began a wildcat strike for better wages. Six days later, the police used live ammunition to brutally suppress the strike, killing 34 and injuring many more.



### Geoffrey Smith / Ukraine / 2009

What is it like to have God-like surgical powers, yet to struggle against your own humanity? What is it like to try and save a life, and yet to fail?



# Daniel Dencik / Greenland / 2013

A real adventure film - for the 21st century. On a three-mast schooner packed with artists, scientists and ambitions worthy of Noah or Columbus, we set off for the end of the world: the rapidly melting icebergs of North-East Greenland.



### Kim Longinotto / India / 2010

The Gulabi Gang is a group of Indian women activists. Most of the Gang's cases concern domestic violence demands, and abusive in-laws.



The Miss India pageant is the ultimate glamour event in a country that has gone mad for beauty contests. Winning the coveted title means instant stardom, a lucrative career path and, for some girls, freedom from the constraints of a patriarchal society.



### Kim Longinotto / Cameroon / 2005

A doc that delves into local courtroom drama in a small town in Cameroon, West Africa, following the state prosecutor and judge - both women - as they fight sexist attitudes and societal norms with a keen knowledge of the law, an acute desire for justice and their own brand of compassion.



# Timothy Albone, Leslie Knott, Lucy Martens / Afghanistan / 2011

An inspirational documentary following the Afghan cricket team who — against all the odds — experience a meteoric rise up the international league tables in their bid to qualify for the World Cup.



# Deborah Perkins / Morocco / 2014

In Morocco, as in all Muslim countries, sex outside marriage is illegal and women bear the brunt of society's disapproval. But what is the fate of the children of single mothers?



### Nima Sarvestani / Afghanistan / 2013

No burgas behind bars is a slice of life from inside one of the most restrictive places on the planet, Takhar Prison in Afghanistan where 40 women inmates, crammed into just four cells, live their lives entirely cut off from outside society.



### Rachel Boynton / Boynton Films Productions / US/Ghana / 2013

Big Men is about the struggle for money, acclaim and oil in Africa. It's an epic adventure of high-stakes capitalism, with shockingly intimate access to company executives, government officials and gun-toting militants. Kosmos Energy, a Dallas-based oil company, discovers Ghana's first oil.



### lise & Femke van Velzen / Congo / 2011

Justice For Sale follows Claudine, a young and courageous human rights lawyer, in her struggle against injustice and widespread impunity in Congo. She investigates the case of Masamba, a soldier who was convicted of rape, and discovers that his trial was corrupt and unfair. He was jailed without any concrete evidence.



### Jonathan Stack and Saralena Weinfield / Philippines Haiti US / 2013

A urologist from Florida on a mission to save the planet "spreading the gospel of vasectomy". A modern day Don Quixote; part dreamer and part visionary committed to the impossible guest of lowering the population on the planet, one vasectomy at a time.



# Berit Madsen / Iran / 2013

Sepideh wants to become an astronaut. She spends her nights exploring the secrets of the universe, while her family will do anything to keep her on the ground.




