



# The Future of Work

Afternoon seminar, May 2, 2019

The world of work is changing. Technological progress, globalisation and ageing populations are re-shaping the labour market. At the same time, new organisational business models and evolving worker preferences are contributing to the emergence of new forms of work.

- How will these trends affect the quality and quantity of work in the future?
- Will globalisation and technological developments lead to a decline in overall employment?
- Will all segments of the global workforce be able to benefit from the opportunities generated by the economy, or will there be a growing disparity between winners and losers?
- How can policy makers prevent these trends from generating growing discontent and having negative ramifications for productivity, growth, wellbeing, and even the stability of our democracies?

These are some of the central questions addressed in the OECD Employment Outlook 2019, which will be published on April 25, 2019.

With a series of chapters covering a range of policy areas, including labour market regulation, adult learning, social protection, and collective bargaining, the Employment Outlook 2019 offers a detailed discussion on how policy makers can address these challenges and how workers can prepare for them.
