A clubhome in a house





What to do?

- Police informed the Public Order & Safety department of the municipality of Amsterdam
- A Taskforce was formed using the RIEC-platform
- Relevant RIEC-partners looked into their systems: Who lives in this house and who is registered there? How many people live there? Who owns the house? Are there any complaints from the neighbourhood? What is the criminal background of the tenants.
- The Taskforce made a plan of action to enter and make an inspection of the house

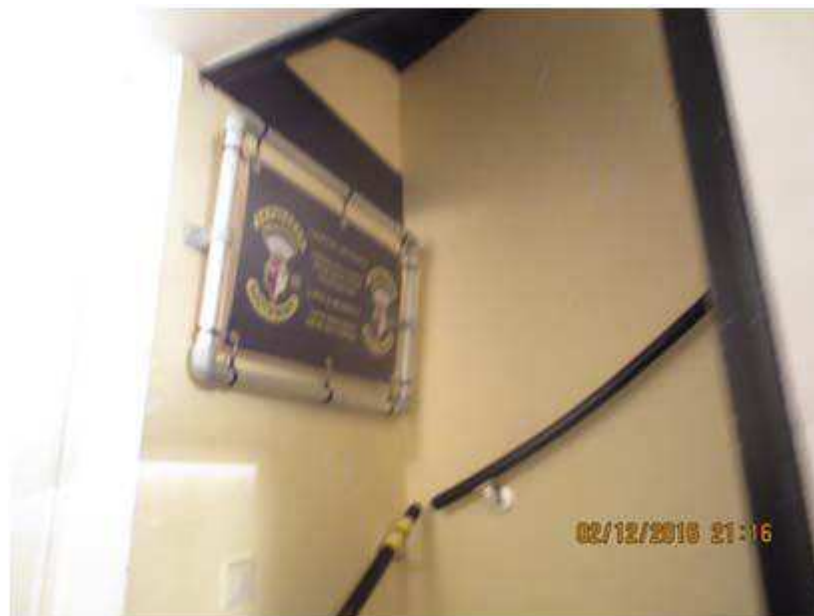
Plan of action

- Public Order & Safety Dept. contacted the Dept. of Housing
- Dept. of Housing possesses legal grounds to enter and inspect a house or building.
- Housing Law and an authorisation to enter of the Mayor
- On 2nd of December 2016 City employees entered the house with the police
- GOAL: to identify how the house was being used

Official findings

- Most of the House was being used as a Club home
- House is being withdrawn from the housing market



(Administrative) actions

- Dept. of Housing imposed a fine of €13.500 and a preventative penalty of € 50.000, due if the clubactivities continued
- 29th of June, Eigen Haard went to court to dissolve the contract
- 9th of July came the verdict of the Court



Successful cooperation

- First time Civil Court ruling in the Netherlands
- Different partners working together within the RIEC structure with a common objective
- Signal for other OMCGs that governments will act together
- This case can be an example for other municipalities in the Netherlands
- The plan of action is turned into a working method



Violence at a bar



- On the 12th of September 2016 a massive fight took place in Café Nasty
- Police took the security camera footage
- Group of men walked from Rembrandtsplein to Thorbeckeplein to Café Nasty
- Entrance was denied by the doormen
- Group of men hit the doormen and go inside
- Bar stools and glasses were being thrown in the cafe, visitors run outside



Area bans in Amsterdam

- Four men got a area ban for Rembrandtplein, Thorbeckeplein and Leidseplein for a duration of three months
- In January 2017 two area bans were extended for another three months because of a fight in Bells Club Amstelveen



Violence at a club

- 25th of Dec 2016 another massive fight in Bells Club Amstelveen





Area bans in Amstelveen

- Five area bans in Amstelveen
- Neighbouring Municipalities work together
- Two earlier bans were extended



Successful cooperation

- Also in these incidents multiple agencies worked together for an integrated reaction to the events
- These incidents were used in the proceedings at the Civil Court to get a ban on Satudarah
