It has been awarded the following distinctions: the National Teachers Prize (for innovation) in 2010, considered one of the 50 best social projects in the EU both in 2013 and 2014, an honourable mention by the Foundation Mota Engil (Oporto) in 2017. In 2018, it was declared by AGEAS the best social project of the year and given the gold medal commemorating the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of The Universal Declaration of Human Rights by the Portuguese Parliament. The "Orquestra Geração" is a member of the Sistema Europe and sits on its board.*
